

HUNTING/TRAPPING REGULATIONS

All persons must have, in their possession, a valid Mississippi hunting license and agree to read and abide by the terms outlined in these regulations prior to accessing U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (COE) lands.

State and federal wildlife laws, including local firearm ordinances, apply to Project hunting lands with the following additional exceptions and restrictions:

- 1. All-Terrain Vehicles (ATV's) are allowed for the purposes of deer and feral hog game retrieval only. (See the Deer and Feral Hog Retrieval Policy)
- 2. Individuals with disabilities may request an individual ATV permit from the Arkabutla Lake Field Office to allow for transportation to and from hunting locations. Proof of disability will be required to obtain an individual permit.
- 3. All firearms in boats underway or ATV's in transit must be unloaded and cased.
- 4. All motor vehicles shall remain on gravel roads at all times.
- 5. The Askew Wildlife Management Area is open to waterfowl hunting on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays until noon **only**. Waterfowl shooting hours will begin 30 minutes before sunrise and will end at noon each day.
- 6. Decoys must be removed daily.
- 7. Only temporary blinds for waterfowl hunting and portable tree stands/ground blinds for deer hunting will be allowed and must be removed daily. Climbing spikes are not permitted. Placement of blinds or stands shall not be used as a means of reserving a hunting location. (See Duckblind/Deer Stand Policy)
- 8. The trapping and/or releasing of feral hogs on Corps of Engineers lands is strictly prohibited. <u>Hunters</u> <u>in violation of moving and/or releasing live hogs on Corps property will be cited under CFR Title 36</u> <u>Section 327 and reported to the appropriate Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks</u> <u>law enforcement officials.</u>
- 9. Hunting hogs with the aid of dogs is prohibited. <u>Hunters in violation of this regulation may be cited under</u> <u>CFR Title 36 Section 327 and reported to the appropriate Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries</u> <u>and Parks law enforcement officials.</u>
- 10. Running/training of dogs is prohibited from March 1st through May 31st, unless a special event permit has been obtained.
- 11. Forfeiture of hunting privileges: Any violation of federal, state, or local hunting, trespass, or game regulations may result in forfeiture of privileges for a period to be determined by U.S. magistrate. The violator may also be subject to fines and/or imprisonment.
- 12. All other CFR Title 36 rules and regulations governing Corps of Engineer property will apply.
