

- No Hunting Areas
Hunting is restricted in the areas shaded in red. Also restricted in these areas are trapping, hunting dogs, spotlighting, headlighting and loaded firearms. All firearms transported through this area should be unloaded, encased and placed in the farthest vehicle compartment. Boundaries of the no hunting areas are signed and marked in red.
- Primitive Weapon/Shotgun Only
The use of high powered rifles is prohibited in the areas shaded in orange. Primitive weapons/shotguns in areas expect for .22 rimfire rifles will be allowed for squirrel, rabbit and raccoon.
- Archery Area Only
The Campbell and Sunfish Bay Areas shaded in purple are designated as Archery Only. Always check the area bulletin boards for the latest guidelines or restrictions.
- Waterfowl Area
Waterfowl hunting in the Mud Hole Area shaded light brown is restricted to hunting from 30 minutes before sunrise to 2:00 p.m. daily during the open waterfowl season.
- No ATVs Allowed

Alcohol of any kind is not permitted on Federal Property under the control of the Arkabutla Lake Field Office.


Your Safety - Our Concern

Beginning May 22, 2009, new life jacket wear requirements will be in effect on the waters of the four US Army Corps of Engineers Vicksburg District-North Mississippi lakes.

The new life jacket requirements effective on the waters of Arkabutla, Sardis, Enid and Grenada lakes are:

- All persons must wear a Type I, II, or III US Coast Guard-approved life jacket at all times while swimming outside of designated swimming areas. Waivers may be issued by Park Managers to exempt participants of special events, such as triathlons, from this requirement while participating in the event.
- All persons must wear a Type I, II, or III US Coast Guard-approved life jacket at all times while skiing or being pulled by a vessel, regardless of vessel length.
- All persons must wear a Type I, II, or III US Coast Guard-approved life jacket on powered vessels 16 feet to 26 feet in length whenever under power by the main propulsion unit. (This does not include when the vessel is stationary or when it is powered by a trolling motor.)
- All persons must wear a Type I, II, or III US Coast Guard-approved life jacket at all times on powered vessels less than 16 feet in length or on non-powered vessels, regardless of length. (Non-powered vessels include, but are not limited to canoes, kayaks, sailboats, paddleboats, and flatbottoms/john boats.)

WIND WARNING LIGHTS

Wind warning lights, which are visible from most areas of the lake, are provided for your safety. Devices are located at the Dam, Hernando Point, Pleasant Hill and Kelley's Crossing. The purpose of the wind warning system is to warn boaters of the existence of potentially hazardous lake conditions. High wind conditions are present when the strobe light is flashing.

Please become familiar with the location of these lights and observe them frequently. Boaters are responsible for their own safety and should be prepared to seek shelter when inclement weather exists.
